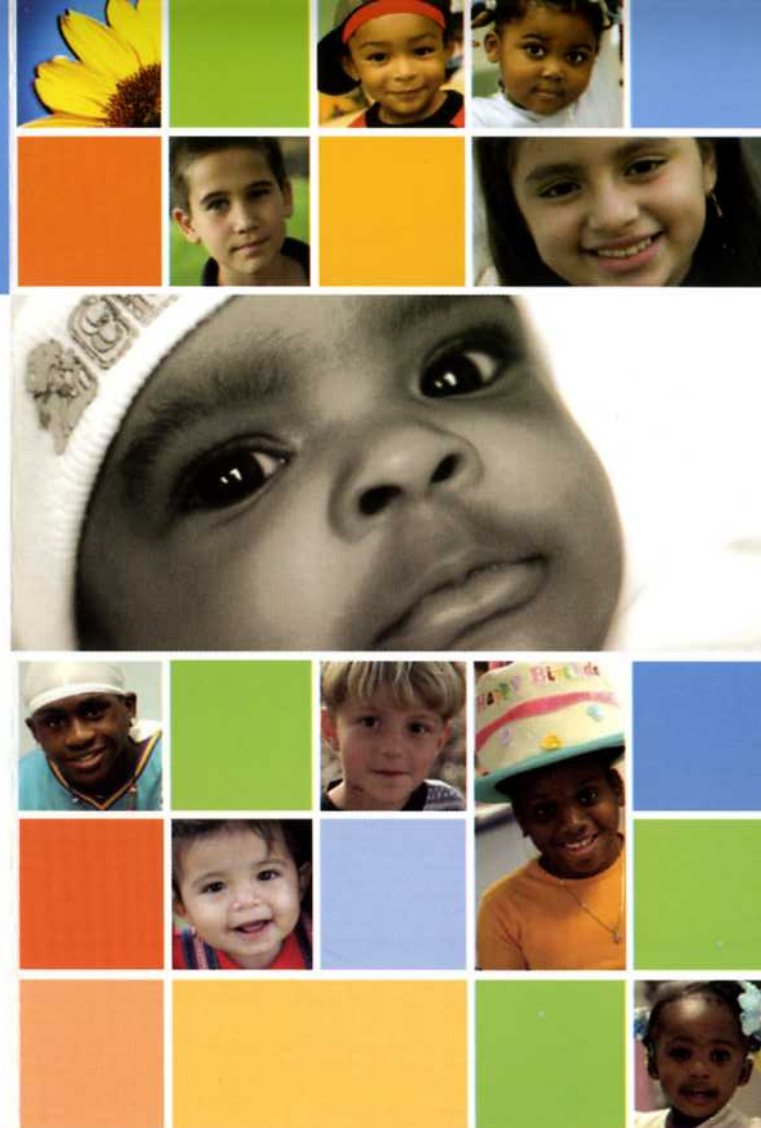

Our Programs

Primary Care Clinic's "Medical Home" provides family-centered primary and specialty health-care for uninsured and under-insured children, regardless of a family's ability to pay. Clinic services also include nutrition, health education, developmental assessment and social work to assure that families are linked to other necessary support and services.

Early Intervention Program provides multidisciplinary evaluation and therapy to infants and toddlers who are at risk for, or who have been identified with, a developmental disability or handicapping condition. Without intervention, large numbers of these children would require costly special education services at school age.

The Children's Diagnostic & Treatment Center is a not-for-profit, nationally recognized Center of Excellence.

Comprehensive Family AIDS Program provides services to infants, children, youth, women and families infected and affected by HIV/AIDS. CFAP is a one-stop location for medical care, case management, social support, dental care, emergency assistance, access to research, mental health services and special activities.



Home Intervention Program designed to increase parenting confidence and capacity to promote the potential of children with special health-care needs. Programming provides for home based therapies for depressed mothers, "Out of the Blue," and intervention for high risk infants, "Promising Futures."

Research committed to increasing services and resources for our patients, CDTC has a distinguished history of participation in nationally recognized research. The Center's Research Program is the only nonuniversity site in the country for the Pediatric AIDS Clinical Trials Group funded by the National

Additional Support Services CDTC offers families emergency assistance, food from our Food Pantry, clothing from our Donations Closet and a place to do laundry and provide their children with a meal in the Family Living Center.

Our History—Established in 1983 when Broward County had one of the highest infant mortality rates in the country, CDTC began with a staff of three in a small room in Broward General and has since grown to be the largest child healthcare provider in Broward County, serving 11,000 children with chronic illnesses and disabilities, annually.
